Director's Note SYNOPSIS OF THE COMEDY OF ERRORS

Twenty-five years before the start of the play, Egeon, a merchant from Syracuse who was traveling abroad with his wife, became the father of identical twin sons. At the same time, he purchased a pair of identical twin boys to be servants to his sons. Egeon, his wife, and the four babies were sailing home when they were shipwrecked in a storm. Egeon managed to save only one of his sons and one of the servant twins, and he has not seen the rest of his family since then. In honor of their missing brothers, both twins adopted their brothers' names: Antipholus and Dromio. Seven years ago, Antipholus and Dromio left Egeon to search for their brothers. After they'd been gone two years, Egeon set off to search for them as well as their twins.

At the start of *The Comedy of Errors*, Antipholus and Dromio have just arrived in Ephesus, unaware that Egeon has also just arrived there. As citizens of Syracuse, a city at war with Ephesus, all three have entered Ephesus illegally. Egeon is immediately arrested and will be executed at the end of the day unless he can pay a ransom to the Duke. Antipholus and Dromio are luckier: a friendly, Ephesian merchant intervenes, so they know to keep their citizenship secret. Unknown to the three travelers, the long-lost Antipholus and Dromio have been living in Ephesus for many years.

And now the farce begins as a series of improbable mishaps, stemming from mistaken identities, leads to a veritable comedy of errors: Ephesian strangers greet the twins from Syracuse like old friends, which creeps out the Syracusans; Antipholus of Syracuse discovers he has a wife; Dromio of Syracuse finds he's betrothed to a kitchen maid; and all sorts other misunderstandings abound. We hope you enjoy the silliness!




