Director's Note

Director's notes are often used as an outlet for directors to wax philosophically, so I will spare you the profundity - mostly. Live theatre serves a variety of roles in society, but sometimes it serves the most basic purpose by bringing the community together to have a good time and escape day-to-day monotony.

Comedies tend to be more high-brow in the theatre. Wordplay amidst absurd situations has built laughs since Wilde to Simon to the contemporary musical theatre. Evil Dead: The Musical takes a different approach. Through embracing Sam Raimi's original trilogy's camp and silliness, I have ventured into gross-out collegiate comedy taking the tiniest moment of absurdity and pushing it into the stratosphere at every chance. This comedy relies on sight gags, puns, melodrama, and crude humor.

At first glance, this seemingly 'easy' show is extremely intricate. Finding the appropriate humor, adding additional humor and situations, leveling up an already absurd story, staying respectful of the films and cult following, carefully and meticulously curating fight sequences and using blood appropriately, building vessels for blood delivery, and ensuring all is done safely. This has been the ride of a lifetime that has provided joy in unexpected and ridiculous ways.

As a result of the hard work the cast and production team have put into this production, I am extremely grateful and proud. With that in mind, I invite you to enjoy the experience we all are here for. Laugh out loud, I promise - it will feel good! Please enjoy this wild, campy, bloody ride that is Evil Dead: The Musical.
