

Directors' Notes

Picasso at the Lapin Agile has always been a slightly frustrating play for me. The script tackles so many subjects dear to my heart; art, science, the moments of history, and human relationships. It's a play about talented, soon-to-be-famous young men at the turn of the 20th century written by a talented, world-famous middle-aged man at the turn of the 21st century. All the elements are there to create a comedic, heartfelt, and thoughtful play, but every production I've seen has been very well done, but left me wanting more.

When given the chance to direct this show, I requested we place the audience directly within the Lapin Agile, turning them into patrons, observers, workers and artists who have the chance to interact with Einstein, Picasso, and the less-famous customers of the establishment. I've worked with the cast to bring out the sense of wonder that's embedded in the story, and to focus not only on the grand scale magic that happens at the end, but the little miracles that happen between people when they first meet, when they've been friends forever, when they've had brief moments fondly remembered, or are wildly in love.

I hope we've achieved the wonder that Steve Martin included in his script over 30 years ago, and I hope we've made you laugh and think. Mostly, I hope you enjoyed your time at the Lapin Agile. We've enjoyed having you.

Paris in 1904!

It was an exciting place full of new inventions, innovative art, and a daring hope for the future! In the Lapin Agile, we meet people on the brink of something new and those who are perhaps clinging to the past. Twenty-three year old Picasso is constantly looking forward to what he will do next. In 1904, Picasso was about to leave his "Blue Period" behind and transition into what is known as the "Rose Period". During the course of the play, you will hear reference to and see many pieces of art and art movements. The end of the play concludes with the unveiling of Les Demoiselle D'Avignon. It would be amiss to not mention that Picasso's cubist style was highly influenced by "primitive art". He drew heavily from the sharp angular lines of African Art. So while cubism was considered to be a new movement of art, the style certainly existed already. Les Demoiselle D'Avignon is at the end of Picasso's Rose Period as he transitions into Cubism. This piece exemplifies the tempest of emotion happening inside of Picasso's head. His anxiety, his lust, his depression, his rivalry with Matisse (many view this painting as a response to Henri Matisse's Le Bonheur De Vivre and Blue Nude). We are meeting him at a pivotal moment.

Albert Einstein, aged twenty five, was facing a transitional period of his life as well. In 1904 he was a recent graduate who could not find work in his field. So he ended up working in a patent office in Zurich (no he was not in Paris at this time, but it's theater so it's okay that he is in the play!). While working in this office, Einstein developed some of his most groundbreaking ideas, including the famed equation, E=mc². To all you recent grads who are struggling to find work, you're in good company.

Both of these men were complex geniuses within their fields and their influence has certainly continued past the 20th century. These transitional moments lead the characters in the play to consider what is genius, how will the future unfold, and what they all have to offer.
